T32 Cardiovascular Disease Epidemiology Training Program



The Department of Epidemiology, Graduate School of Public Health, University of Pittsburgh, is seeking candidates for a postdoctoral training fellowship in cardiovascular disease epidemiology available as early as July 1, 2021. This program is funded by the National Heart, Lung, Blood Institute/National Institutes of Health. We are seeking a highly talented postdoctoral fellow (PhD, MD and equivalent) for a 2-3-year fellowship. Fellows receive a stipend commensurate with their level of training and other benefits that may include tuition for an MS or MPH degree if needed. Candidates must be either a U.S. citizen or have permanent residency status. We are committed to increasing representation of underrepresented minority research scientists in this fellowship program. The University of Pittsburgh considers the diversity of its students, faculty, and staff to be a strength and critical to its educational mission.

The primary goal of our T32 program is to train individuals in cardiovascular epidemiology based on a pathophysiological understanding and experiential learning to thereby help develop in the future better prevention strategies. Our philosophy is to provide a core foundation of didactic training in cardiovascular epidemiology with strong methodological and quantitative skills that are customized to the experience and background of each trainee.

The program emphasizes the quality collection of subclinical vascular measures, biomarkers of cardiovascular disease, and cardiovascular disease outcomes data and how they can be used to understand the process of atherosclerosis and cardiovascular disease onset and progression with the goal of being independent cardiovascular epidemiologists competent in traditional and novel epidemiological methods in cardiovascular disease in multidisciplinary research settings.
